- Week 1** **James 1:1** James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ: To the twelve tribes dispersed abroad. Greetings. *Life's Tough. Get a Spiritual Helmet. James 1:1-18*

- Week 2** **James 1:2-3** Consider it a great joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you experience various trials, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance.

- Week 3** **James 1:4** And let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking nothing. *Playing Favorites James 2:1-13*

- Week 4** **James 1:5** Now if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God—who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly—and it will be given to him. *Faith—> Works. Always James 2:14-26*

- Week 7** **James 1:9-10** Let the brother of humble circumstances boast in his exaltation, but let the rich boast in his humiliation because he will pass away like a flower of the field.

- Week 8** **James 1:11** For the sun rises and, together with the scorching wind, dries up the grass; its flower falls off, and its beautiful appearance perishes. In the same way, the rich person will wither away while pursuing his activities. *Patience. He's Coming Back. James 5:7-12*

- Week 9** **James 1:12** Blessed is the one who endures trials, because when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love Him.

Tips for Memorizing Scripture

1. Say a few words at a time over and over out loud. When you get those down, add more words.
2. Write it over and over.
3. Put it on a white or chalk board. Read it over and over. Erase words and read it again until you're able to say it with no words on the board.
4. Put it on a card or several cards that you place in strategic places in your house and/or car.
5. Set reminders on your phone or other devices to remind you to look at and/or recite the verses.
6. Come up with a song, hand motions, and/or draw pictures for key words.
7. Stick with it even if you miss a couple of days or if it takes you a while to get it down.

Memorizing God's Word has many benefits including growing in spiritual disciplines, growing your relationship with the Lord, and tuning your heart to the Spirit.
